Commission on Dental Accreditation

On January 31, 2025 the Commission adopted the Accreditation Standards for Advanced Dental Education Programs in Endodontics, related to the intent statement of Standard 2-2, for administrative oversight at major sites where educational activity occurs, with immediate implementation.

Accreditation Standards for Advanced Dental Education Programs in Endodontics

1	STANDARD 2 - PROGRAM DIRECTOR AND TEACHING STAFF		
2	The program must be administered by one director who is board certified in the respective advanced
